A REPORT ON INAUGURATION OF THE INDUSIND BANK NAGESH CRICKET TOURNAMENT FOR THE BLIND

The Cricket Association for the Blind in India (CABI) in association with Samarathanam Trust for the Disabled, launched the **IndusInd Bank Nagesh Trophy Cricket Tournament For the Blind** supported by IndusInd Bank on November 25 at the RV Teacher's college Auditorium, Jayanagar. The event drew cricket enthusiasts, staff of the Non-Profit Trust, Head of Corporates, Government Dignitaries and members of the blind cricket team.

The tournament will begin end of November 2018 till mid of February 2019. In the course of the three month event, twenty three States of India will participate in the tournament and will play T20 matches with the teams lined-up in four pools for the league matches followed with quarterfinal, semifinal and the final championship match.

The event was graced by Guests of honor, **Shri B S Chandrasekhar**, Former Indian cricketer, **Mr Rajeev Gowda**, Member of Parliament, Rajya Sabha, GOI and **Mr Prabhu Sivaramakrishnan**, Sr VP & Zonal Head – Operations – IndusInd Bank, the title sponsor for the event

The inauguration of the cricket tournament was organized in memory and honor of Late SP Nagesh, Founder of Samarathanam trust, who was a friend, mentor and an avid cricketer himself, who motivated every blind cricketer passionate about the sport to go beyond barriers. Mr Nagesh, a visionary, pioneered the structuring of the Cricket Association for the Blind in India and Blind Cricket across the globe and envisioned the empowerment of the visually impaired through cricket, our country's favorite sport.

Match - 1

Andhra Pradesh vs Jammu & Kashmir

Jammu & Kashmir won the toss and elected to bat first and were bowled out for 85 in 15.3 overs. Azeem top scored with 37 Runs and none of the players reached double figures. Ajay Kumar Reddy took 4 for 11 in 4 overs, Dunna Venkateswara Rao took 2 for 0 in 1.3 overs, Durga Rao, Nagaraj and Lakshman took a wicket each. In reply Andhra Pradesh chased 86 Runs in 7.3 Overs with opener Ravi unbeaten on 40 and Ajay Kumar Reddy not out on 19 for Jammu & Kashmir Ajay Thakur took a wicket and Andhra Pradesh won the match by 8 Wickets.

After the initial matches of The IndusInd Bank Nagesh Trophy were held in Ananthpur the tournament next moved to the northern States of Punjab and Haryana. The teams battled hard to get to the next stage of the tournament and gave a good account of themselves.

Match 1: Buoyed by India international Deepak Malik's all round performance power house Haryana came out victorious against southern state of Telangana. Telangana 110/4 in 20 overs. Haryana 111/3 in 11.5 overs. Haryana won by 7 wickets. Man of the match: Deepak Malik
